With our Headquarters now situated in the central western part of the country, satellite camps / lodges and concessions are located in either Central or Northern Namibia, close to Etosha National Park. The safari hunting areas are home to a wide variety of African Game and Birds. With over a decade of guiding experience and more than 70 000 hectares of pristine habitat you will team up with some of the finest guides in Namibia. In the bouquet you'll find open, savannah like grass plains with Acacia trees and dense Mopani bush. We like to share with our clients what we love the most: ranging the magical bushveld with its multitude of vibrant and elegant game roaming the open plains. Our deluxe traditional tented camps certainly offer more than just accommodation.



NAMIBIA - FREE RANGE HUNTING SAFARI

Game Trackers Africa Safaris CC (in collaboration with its partners in some instances) currently operates in various Concessions in the Caprivi, boasting some of Caprivi's best hunting areas on the Chobe River. Each area is unique in its own way, offering a variety of vegetation types and zones, allowing the hunter to pursue game in different areas as they move across this free-range landscape, to pursue the hunt. These concessions are situated on the Namibian side north of the famous Chobe River. With a total of 145 000ha this forms the largest continuous chunk of land for elephant hunting in the Eastern Zambezi region.

SOSSUSVLEI

Situated in the heart of the Namib Naukluft Park, Sossusvlei, one of the most fascinating landscapes in Namibia, is a photographer's dream. Gigantic orange dunes, dramatic shadows, undulating plains and rocky mountains create a magical kaleidoscope of colours and shapes. Aside from the attractions at Sossusvlei - Dune 45, Hiddenvlei, Big Daddy and Deadvlei - other attractions in the area include the Sesriem Canyon and Namib-Naukluft National Park, where the mountains of the Namib meet its plains. To the east, the Namib Rand Nature Reserve's vast sandy plains are surrounded by towering granite mountains and rolling dunes. Here, in the oldest desert on the planet, desert adapted animals and plants come together to form one of the most visually stunning ecosystems in the world. This is truly the best way to experience the heart of the Namib desert is with a hot air balloon safari. Watching the spectacular sunrise over this magnificent landscape from a silent hot air balloon is the experience of a lifetime, never to be forgotten.



ETOSHA

Etosha National Park is unique in Africa. The park's main characteristic is a salt pan so large it can be seen from space. Yet there is abundant wildlife that congregates around the waterholes, giving you almost guaranteed game sightings. At the same time Etosha National Park is one of the most accessible game reserves in Namibia and Southern Africa, whilst boasting impressive numbers of both white and black rhino, lions and some of Africa's biggest bodied elephants. The general area is considered malaria free, while complimented with various luxurious lodges in the surrounding area.

SWAKOPMUND

Founded in 1892 as the main harbour for German South West Africa, Swakopmund is often described as being more German than Germany. Now a seaside resort, Swakopmund is the capital of the Skeleton Coast tourism area and has plenty to keep visitors happy. The quirky mix of German and Namibian influences, colonial-era buildings and the cool sea breeze makes it very popular destination and is complimented with a variety of well recommended restaurants.



NORTHERN CAPE ROCKWOOD CONSERVATION

"BEYOND HUNTING"

Rockwood is located in the Northern Cape Province of South Africa. This secluded hidden jewel of Central South Africa, nestled between the Great Karoo to the South and the Kalahari Desert to the North is waiting on you - ready to knock your socks off! This pristine 33 000 plus acres oasis getaway conservancy includes a 22 000 plus acres hunting area and lies about 120 miles west of Kimberley, the "Diamond City", far from the hustle and bustle.

Our 5-star safari lodge offers luxury, air-conditioned villas and cottages (which can accommodate a maximum of 22 guests), with a private lounge and dining area, boma and fire



pit, as well as full bar and restaurant. The lodge also offers an on-site spa, gym, swimming pool and curio boutique. We even have wifi, although our location is so remote. Rockwood is ideal for families and friends or traditional hunters who is in need of a different experience with a change to the touch and feel of your traditional safari, although the ingredients are the same, just a combination of luxury, family activities and hunting in one base camp. Guest are hosted separately or together in private family accommodation with private luxury rooms and living areas with the option to be entertained privately at their Villa or sharing the central restaurant facilities.

This is an ideal opportunity for the wildlife enthusiast looking for a family vacation to view game, relax in style, take part in a variety of outdoor activities, indulge in photography, a traditional hunt, and for the family hunt enthusiasts, you have found the spot for a traditional hunting experience with an edge....! You will experience comfort and style off the beaten path exceeding your expectations.

Rockwood host in excess of 400 southern white rhino which is under severe threat and at the current rate of poaching and skewed sex ratios, on the road to extinction. Here you will experience "conservation in motion through utilisation" where hunting of other healthy game populations are subsidising the conservation of the southern white rhino

Guests will be given the opportunity to have an up close and personal encounter with rhinos, you will be educated on this important specie, narrowly survived extinction before, and the role we together with our clients are playing in their continuing struggle for survival. Bar the security and safety measures in place to keep rhino safe and poachers out. This concession is on a pristine stretch where the Savanna and Nama-Karoo biomes meet, the habitat rhinos would have roamed for millennia. The stretch of arid to semi-arid desert and bushveld terrain consist of brush covered hills with valleys in between, and flat grass covered areas decorated with a large number of Rockwood trees (wild olive). Ideal for walk and stalk with good visibility for



successful hunting

Come and live for a change the African Legacy at this pristine stylish safari area where you will experience the close relationship between hunting and conservation first hand and allow yourself to take a step back in time and explore the wild ancestral hunting grounds of the past. A large variety of plains game species are roaming Rockwood including roan antelope, sable, eland, oryx, kudu, wildebeest, red hartebeest, zebra and boasts in excess of 300 free roaming Cape buffalo. Rockwood also provides for excellent bow hunting experiences with ergonomic designed blinds or walk and stalk options.



ROCKWOOD - RHINO CONSERVATION

EXPERIENCE RHINOS LIKE NOWHERE ELSE- Rockwood host one of the largest privately own southern white rhino population, exceeding 400, globally. Effective management of this endangered species has resulted in no further recorded poaching incidents

For millions of years, rhinos have supported other lifeforms in their ecosystem. Now they are disappearing. Currently, rhino deaths outnumber births - all for a belief that their horns have medicinal properties and convey status.

Our ultimate goal is to see rhinos walk free again. Until then, we are committed to protecting and repopulating the species, in a controlled environment, to prevent white rhino extinction.

It is estimated that rhinos will completely disappear from national parks and reserves within the next ten years. To date, we have celebrated more than 160 rhino births at Rockwood, and no poaching in the last five years. The answer to true rhino conservation lies in private involvement.



EASTERN CAPE

The hunting areas are vast with tremendous variety of species available to the serious hunter. Here we have several very large hunting concessions where you are accommodated in either very comfortable thatched-style bush camps or in the original ranch style homesteads, some well over a 100 years old. Typical South African dishes are served with outstanding locally produced wines. This area consists of a wide variety of habitats, varying from coastal brush and valleys to the Winterberg Mountain range 7 000 ft up in some places. Species typical to the region are Blue Duiker, Grysbuck, Bushpig, Caracal, Oribi, Mountain Reedbuck, Vaal Reedbuck, Cape Bushbuck, and Cape Kudu amongst many others.



LIMPOPO

In the central northern part of the Limpopo Province of South Africa on a pristine privately owned nature reserve, we offer 10 000 ha of typical African bush veld which varies from open country to very dense bush. Creeks and gullies open into marsh areas which makes hunting a unique and real African experience. The diversity of the terrain supports a large variety of birds and mammals. Animals like Elephant, White Rhino, Nyala, Zebra, Hippo and the rare Black Rhino are just some of the wildlife you can encounter.

KRUGER NATIONAL PARK

The largest amongst Africa's National Parks, the Kruger National Park is basically a synonym for the word "safari." Home to over 500 bird species, 100 reptiles, nearly 150 mammals, multiple archaeological sites, and a stunningly diverse variety of trees and flowers, Kruger is the country's flagship national park. Adventurers can explore the park in a 4x4, take a bush walk or fly above in a hot-air balloon.

CAPE TOWN

Perched between the ocean and the mountain, with a national park at its heart, there is nowhere like Cape Town. Cape Town, the "Mother City", is the oldest city in Southern Africa and has a cultural heritage spanning more than 350 years. It boasts the top five national attractions of South Africa. These include a visit up Table Mountain, either by cable car or climbing up routes of varying degrees of difficulty and Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens, internationally acclaimed as one of the great botanical gardens of the world. The Victoria & Alfred Waterfront, one of the city's main tourist attractions, offers the visitor a unique shopping and holiday experience on a scenic working harbour.

VICTORIA FALLS (ZAMBIA)

Resting on the southern banks of the Zambezi River at the western end of the eponymous falls, this popular tourist town is compact enough to walk around and makes an ideal base for travellers exploring the seventh wonder of the world, the unfathomably vast Victoria Falls. About two thirds of the falls can be viewed from the Zimbabwean side and, while the falls are undoubtedly the star attraction, the area provides both adventure seekers and sightseers with plenty of opportunities to warrant a longer stay. Popular activities include scenic flights over the falls in helicopters or micro lights, bungee jumping off the Victoria Falls Bridge, white-water rafting (seasonal), and day trips to Chobe National Park. The falls can also be visited from the luxury Royal Livingstone Hotel on the Zambian side.

SELOUS GAME RESERVE

The Selous Game Reserve, covering 50,000sqkm / 19,000sqm, is amongst the largest protected areas in Africa, which also makes it one of Africa's most prestigious hunting areas. Apart from its abundance of wildlife, the reserve also has an exceptionally high variety of habitats including Miombo woodlands, open grasslands, riverine forests acacia woodlands, dry creek beds and swamps, making it a valuable laboratory for on-going ecological and biological processes.

Our hunting acreage comprises of an exceptional 225 300 hectare / 557 000 acres of free range hunting grounds.



LR3 (UTUNGE)

With the main camp situated on Lake Utunge, less than 50 miles away from the Indian Ocean, this beautifully appointed hunting safari camp will comfort you while experiencing a true African hunting safari.

This area comes highly recommended for Leopard, Lion, Buffalo and Elephant hunting for the months of July through November when all the Buffalo from the greater area (and surrounding blocks) congregate around Lake Utunge for water. It is also the same lake, 40 minutes by air charter, southwest of Dar es Salaam where the hunting camp is situated.

The area comprises of 113 000 ha, predominantly sandy terrain with typical acacia habitats in the eastern and southern parts, some Miombo forest combined with

riverine savannah in the southwest with slight rolling slopes, making it ideal Buffalo habitat.

Typical savannah plains, skies lined with Palm trees makes for beautiful scenery and a unique hunting environment - certainly one of the best populated and game rich areas of the Selous Game Reserve.



LR 2 (NAMKONGO) spelling Namkongo

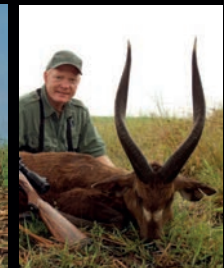
This concession is 1,145 sqkm (114,000ha) it has a diversity of habitat, very similar to it's neighboring Utunge block, varying from Miombo woodland to thorn scrub and thicket belts, complimented with a large sand river running through it called the Kimburu River.

This diverse habitat hosts a wide variety of species, typical to the Selous. Due to the abundance of water Sable, Hartebeest, Crocodile and other plains game are plentiful, complimented with large numbers of Elephant and big Cats roaming the area, needless to mention the number of Cape Buffalo and other species.



WESTERN TANZANIA

Including the game reserves Moyowosi, Kigosi, Ugala Muhesi and Rungwa - these areas boast many quality full maned Lion, Leopard and good numbers of Bushbuck, Eland, Elephant, Greater Kudu, Roan, Sable, Topi, Defassa Waterbuck and other species. The habitat is mainly Miombo forest with open plains and acacia thickets. Other areas have thick brush and sections of swamps which are home to Sitatunga and very large Cape Buffalo. The West is known to be the prime Lion hunting destination in Africa. If you ever dreamt of wild, big maned Lion, then this is your future destination. This truly has the makings for a great safari adventure and unique free range hunting opportunities for the experienced African Hunter.



MASAILAND

In the very northern part of Tanzania, southeast of the Tarangire National Park lies Naibormut. A well-hidden jewel that will provide for basically all your Masai East African Species needs. This scenic area consist of acacia woodland and thorn shrub with wide open plains, rocky outcrops and patches of thick thorn bush. The area produces some outstanding Lesser Kudu, Gerenuk as well as many of the other species found in Masailand such as Lion, Leopard, Buffalo, Dik Dik, Duiker, Eland, Gazelles, Coke's Hartebeest, fringed eared Oryx, white bearded Wildebeest and many more.

SERENGETI

The Serengeti National Park is undoubtedly the best-known wildlife sanctuary in the world, unequalled for its natural beauty and scientific value. It is home to one of the greatest wildlife spectacles on earth - the great migration. Over a million Wildebeest and about 200,000 Zebras flow South from the northern hills to the southern plains for the short rains every October and November, and then swirl West and North after the long rains in April, May and June.

NGORONGORO

A UNESCO protected World Heritage Site and an International Biosphere Reserve, the Ngorongoro Crater floor is a sheer drop of 610 metres below the crater rim. The sight of the Ngorongoro Crater is simply stunning. It is impossible to give a fair description of the size and beauty of the Crater, for there is nothing with which one can compare it to. The crater floor is home to tens of thousands of plains animals, including Wildebeest, Zebra, Gazelles, Elands, and a large predator population of Lions, Hyena and Jackal which can all be viewed at close quarters. The rare Black Rhino can also be found here.

ZANZIBAR

Set like a jewel in tranquil coral waters, only 20 minutes flight from Dar es Salaam, is one of Africa's most beautiful islands - Zanzibar. Zanzibar's coastline offers some of the best beaches in the world. The island's history is indelibly stamped by hundreds of years of trade in spices which has driven and shaped the cultural flavours of the island. Zanzibar's architecture, language and religion are a reflection of both the island's distant and recent past; with the passing dhows that constantly sail along the coastline and the murmurs of the fishermen drifting on the sea breeze, that past is seemingly not so distant.



CAMEROON FOREST

Game Trackers Africa has access to two exclusive hunting areas in the Southeastern part of Cameroon's forest areas. The hunting areas are bordering the Lobeke Park for 40+ miles. Kika, the nearest town and airstrip is only 45 min from camp, while the Lokomo Airstrip is also an option. These concessions are known as one of the best areas for Bongo, Forest Sitatunga, Forest Elephants, Giant Forest Hog & Dwarf Buffalo, which are some of the most interesting animals in the area. Forest hunting is exciting and the local Pigmy people are excellent trackers. Hunting is mainly on foot, but also from machans settled near the edge of large clearings.



CAMEROON SAVANNAH

The areas (18 bis & 16) are located in Northern Cameroon bordering Faro National Park next to the Faro River. There is a nice variety of Landscape. 70 % of the area is flat with open savannah and little plains. The rest of the area is rolling hills and mountain with a abundance of rivers and streams.

These areas, as well as Zic 27 are very popular especially for Lord Derby Eland hunts, complimented by species such as Savannah Buffalo, Western Roan, Lion, Harnessed Bushbuck and Red Flanked Duiker. The most popular time recommended for this species is January to middle March. Hunting is typically done by tracking these magnificent animals down with the native trackers. There are 19 species of animals to hunt in this area

Accommodation consist out of 3 VIP bungalows with a view of the Faro River. The ammenities consist out of a standard room with a double bed, Aircon and on suite bathroom. Single Beds can be added if needed. The dining areas respectively overlook the Faro and Vina Rivers with a beautiful view of the river. Arrival/departure point in northern Cameroon will be Ngaounderé, via thru Douala.





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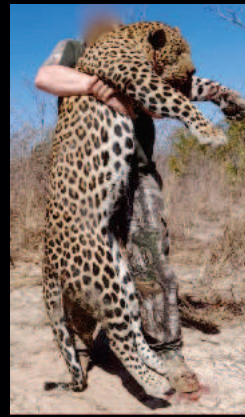


BOTSWANA

LOCATION: NG 4

The Xai-Xai (CQAE CQAE) Community TRUST

- Botswana is a land-locked country of some 220 000 SQM in the center of the Southern Africa plateau with general altitude of around 3000ft above sea level. Gabarone is the capital of Botswana.
- NG 4 tourist hunting area is situated in the heart of the traditional Bushmanland, due east of Namibia - on the popular migration route between Namibia's world renowned Bushmanland community based elephant hunting areas and the Okavango Delta.
- NG 4 - Xai-Xai is the most important bushman settlement, in the area, subsequently the hunting area is referred to as Xai-Xai, a San word meaning "Popular Place of Visitors".
- The hunting camp is situated in close proximity to the well known Gcwihaba Caves which is also a declared world heritage site.
- Xai-Xai situated west from Maun and Southwest of the Okavango Delta, is easily accessible from Maun by road or charter flight if so preferred (1.5 - 2 hours). It will be about a 5 hour drive from Maun (382km / 239 miles).
- The total size of the area together comprises of 310,000 HA (766,000 Acres) or 3,100 Square kms - with a perimeter of 471km (294 Miles).
- Xai-Xai is bordered by Namibia in the west, NG 3 in the north, NG 5 in the east and Ghanzi ranches, south of the Kuke veterinary cut line. The nearest town for basic supplies is situated about 280km / 175 Miles from Xai-Xai. Most supplies for you safari comes directly form Maun.
